



## Consent for Treatment

**We care about you, so we would like to share some of the risks and considerations for dental treatment. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate asking.**

1. All dental and anesthetic procedures have associated risks. There may be, but are not limited to:
  - Drug reactions and side effects
  - Damage to adjacent teeth or fillings
  - A post-operative infection
  - Delayed healing of a tooth after treatment or an extraction site (dry socket), necessitating additional care
  - Bruising, swelling, sensitivity or pain around the dental area
  - Failure or breakage of dental prosthetic (crown, bridge, partial), requiring additional treatment
  - Nerve damage caused during dental treatment (anesthetic or tooth work) that can create temporary or permanent numbness or tingling of the lip, chin, tongue or other areas around the face (around the eyes, nose, or cheeks)
  - Complications during treatment that may necessitate a referral to a specialist
2. I am aware that I have the option to decline treatment, but understand there are consequences of non-treatment.
3. I have disclosed all of my health history information, including allergies, reactions to medications, diseases, and past procedures. I understand withholding information may affect the outcome of the procedure(s) or course(s) of treatment.
4. I authorize Dr. Kimberly Martin, Dr. Wendy Churchill, Dr. Patricia Martin or other qualified dental professionals to perform necessary dental services.
5. I authorize University Family Dental, PC, to perform any necessary, life-saving procedures in the event of an emergency during the course of treatment.

## Warranty of Treatment

We strive to do the best dentistry possible, but sometimes, dentistry fails. We want to make your mouth comfortable and are pleased to repair or replace work/prosthetic devices, if viewed necessary with due cause; within six months for night guards, one year of placement of fillings, and three years within placement of crowns, bridges, and dentures. **All recommended hygiene recalls *must be up to date* for the warranty to be considered.**
